While at WCHS, she was a member of Big Brothers & Sisters, the Mock Trial Club, and Vice President of the French National Honor Society. After graduation, she attended Villanova University and The George Washington University Law School. She was an NCAA All-Academic and Big East Academic All Star, a repeat NCAA regional qualifier, and a Penn Relays and New Balance Collegiate Invitational high jump champion. Today she is an attorney at the firm of Reed Smith where she focuses on complex civil litigation, employment law, and government investigations. Her pro bono practice, for which she has been recognized as a member of the Capitol Pro Bono Honor Roll with high honors, is a source of great pride as it focuses on family law and child abuse and neglect cases. Ms. Bayly applies these same driven qualities that she learned through the sport of running to her everyday life. Pat Fisher


Coach/ Athletic Director



Pat Fisher won 100 Girls' Varsity Basketball games during her tenure in Montgomery County. She led our Bulldogs to both of their championships in 2002 and 2003. In 2001, she led the Bulldogs as State Championship Finalists and in 2004, her team was the Montgomery County Division Champions. She was Coach of the Year in the Montgomery Journal and the Gazette in 2001, 2002, and 2003 and was The Washington Post 2002 All-Met Coach of the Year. During her tenure as Athletic Director at Winston Churchill High School, she brought the school into compliance with federally mandated Title IX gender equity requirements in terms of spending and facility usage. She is a NIAAA Certified Athletic Administrator and a member of the Maryland State Athletic Directors Association.

Athletic Director



Peter Menke is being inducted posthumously. Mr. Menke was the Athletic Director at Winston Churchill High School from 1989 to 1997. In 1990, he was named MCPS Athletic Director of the Year. From 1992-94, he served as the President of the Maryland State Athletic Director's Association. In 1992, he was voted the MSADA's State Athletic Director of the Year, and in 1999 he was named to the MSADA Hall of Fame. As an Athletic Director, he used his position to fight for girls' sports to get equal attention and resources. He also coached in MCPS. After his career in MCPS, Mr. Menke became mayor of the town of Barnesville in 2001, a position in which he served until his passing in January of 2011. Mr. Menke retired finally as the Athletic Director of Paul IV Catholic High School in Fairfax, Virginia, where the Peter T. Menke Scholar-Athlete award was named in his memory and awarded to the senior who most exemplifies Mr. Menke's characteristics of positivity, loyalty, honestly, and fairness.

Craig Stewart


Community Star
